**Acts 3:14-19 (ESV)**

But you denied the Holy and Righteous One, and asked for a murderer to be granted to you, and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. And his name--by faith in his name--has made this man strong whom you see and know, and the faith that is through Jesus has given the man this perfect health in the presence of you all. "And now, brothers, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. But what God foretold by the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer, he thus fulfilled. Repent therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out. L: This is the Word of the Lord.

**GOSPEL READING**

**John 18:1-11 (ESV) P:**

The Holy Gospel according to St John the eighteenth chapter. **C: Glory to you, O Lord.** When Jesus had spoken these words, he went out with his disciples across the brook Kidron, where there was a garden, which he and his disciples entered. Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place, for Jesus often met there with his disciples. So Judas, having procured a band of soldiers and some officers from the chief priests and the Pharisees, went there with lanterns and torches and weapons. Then Jesus, knowing all that would happen to him, came forward and said to them, "Whom do you seek?" They answered him, "Jesus of Nazareth." Jesus said to them, "I am he." Judas, who betrayed him, was standing with them. When Jesus said to them, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground. So he asked them again, "Whom do you seek?" And they said, "Jesus of Nazareth." Jesus answered, "I told you that I am he. So, if you seek me, let these men go." This was to fulfill the word that he had spoken: "Of those whom you gave me I have lost not one." Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant and cut off his right ear. (The servant's name was Malchus.) So Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword into its sheath; shall I not drink the cup that the Father has given me?" L: This is the Gospel of the Lord. **C: Praise to you, O Christ.**

"Return From Betrayal" 2 Samuel 15:12; 17:1-4 Psalm 41 Acts 3:14-19 John 18:1-11 *ESV*

Introduction and Goal

Our theme for today revolves around betrayal. As we look at the lessons read earlier, may we see ways that our own sins pull us away from God. We will hear His call to return to Him because He offers reconciliation, forgiveness, and peace.
